Looking to Buy Your Child an E-Bike?

Here's what you need to know:



Below are some frequently asked questions you should consider before buying an Electric Bicycle for you or your child.

What are the speed limitations and requirements for Low Speed Electric Bicycles?

Low Speed Electric Bicycles have a maximum speed of 20 mph and a motor wattage of 750 Watts or less. Low Speed E-Bikes do not require a license, registration, or insurance.

Are helmets necessary for riders of Low Speed Electric Bicycles? For Low Speed Electric Bicycle riders, those under 17 must wear helmets.

What are the legal requirements for operating a Class 3 Bicycle in New Jersey? Operators must be over 16 years old, possess a driver's license, and ensure the vehicle is registered and insured. The maximum speed allowed is 28 mph.

Which vehicles are prohibited on public streets, and what are the consequences of using them? Motorized Scooters, Pocket Bikes, and Sport Scooters are prohibited on public streets in New Jersey. Using them can result in the vehicle being towed under statute 39:4-14.13.

5 Are Low Speed Electric
Bikes considered class 1,
2, and 3?

No, Low Speed Electric Bikes are idenftied as Class 1 and Class 2 only.







CLASSIFICATION OF ELECTRIC BIKES

CLASS 1 E-BIKE

- Considered "Low Speed"
- Pedal Assist Only
- No Throttle
- Activate when Rider Pedals
- Top Speed 20mph
- Under 17 Must Wear Helmet
- No Registration or Insurance Required





CLASS 2 E-BIKE

- Considered "Low Speed"
- Throttle Propelled with Pedal Assist
- Top Speed 20mph
- Under 17 Must Wear Helmet
- No Registration or Insurance Required





- Pedal Assist with Optional Throttle
- Top Speed 28mph
- Driver's License Required
- Under 15 Not Allowed
- Helmet Required
- Registration and Insurance Required









ELECTRIC MOTORCYCLE

- NOT considered an E-Bike
- Throttle Only No Pedals
- Driver's License Required
- Motorcycle Endorsement Required
- Helmet Required
- Registration and Insurance Required
